Tealinda Ford passed away Wednesday, April 2, 1980, at Grande Prairie General Hospital after a lengthy

illness.

Hazel was the fifth daughter born to Mathew and Maria Shedin on January 15, 1905 at Wetaskiwin, Alta, Hazel walked into the Peace Country over the Edson Trail when she was five years old with the Charlie Lupton family and lived with the Luptons at Bezanson until her marriage to Ernest Alexander Ford, Dec. 1, 1924. Bezanson man asked to remove trailer

A Bezanson man is finding that building a house — and only then applying for permission to build it — only leads to trouble.

Henry Ford has been asked by the County of Grande Prairie to remove a mobile home from property near the hamlet of Bezanson.

Turned down by several levels of government, Mr. Ford has less than 30 days to move the dwelling, placed on the property with the knowledge it had not yet been approved.

"We're just praying that it will go through," said the soft-spoken farmer. "I guess the one thing that we did wrong was that we didn't get a building permit and went ahead and put it in. I really didn't understand what had to be done."

DEVELOPMENT PERMIT

The County can grant a development permit on a quarter section of land for two houses with no questions asked. Where there are more than two dwellings, however, a resident is required to gain a special waiver from the Alberta Planning Board.

Mr. Ford, after placing a fourth dwelling on the land, was shocked to learn that his waiver application had been turned down.

Turning to the South Peace Regional Planning Commission, Mr. Ford applied for subdivision status — and was turned down by the SPRPC and the Alberta planning appeal board.

"He's pretty well exhausted all of his options," said County assistant manager Ron Pfau. "It's just sitting there empty right now. But that's our problem — it's sitting there illegally and we've no option but to have it removed."

A County lawyer has already served Mr. Ford notice that he must pick the double-wide trailer off its pilings and put it somewhere else.

Mr. Ford, meanwhile, may consider another option. At Monday's County Council meeting, he asked councillors to consider incorporating a portion of his land into the boundaries of Bezanson.

WAIT-AND-SEE

Council took no action and in fact, has developed a wait-and-see stance pending a formal application from Mr. Ford for amendments to the County Land Use Bylaw and General Municipal Plan.

"What he's tried to do is build the house and then get it approved," said County councillor Art Patterson. "Regrettably, it didn't work.

The main objector to the dwelling is the Department of Highways, said Mr. Ford.

"They've said they don't want any more buildings on the north side of the highway," he explained. "There's a school and a store across the road and they don't want anymore people crossing the road.

Mr. Ford does not actually use the mobile home. An oilfield worker, who spends the winter months in the north and summer at his office in Calgary, is the tenant.

Mr. Ford is still hopeful the building will be allowed to stay where it is.

"We'll just have to leave it up to the Lord," he said.


